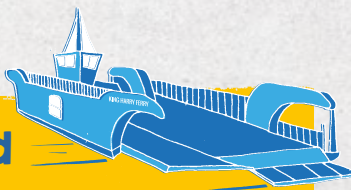
Details of the Stewarding Programme and how to become a Friend of the Festival are at the back of the programme.
